Dear Parents,

Kindergarten students have been very busy this year! Your child is learning how to read with our Superkids curriculum. Students have learned how to identify, write, and say the sounds of the following letters: C, A, G, O, D, T, L, F, I, S, E, and H. Superkids students have learned to sound out words spelled with these letters and have worked on other reading skills such as rhyming and sequencing. Students are also starting to learn some sight words such as *the*, *and*, *what*, and *you* and should be able to read color words such as *red*, *yellow*, and *purple*. During the third quarter students will work on reading number words from zero to ten. We will also focus on the letters U, B, R, N, M, and P.

In math, students have been learning about the concepts of more, less, and equal. Students continue to work on counting and identifying numbers to 50. During the third quarter students will be working on writing the numbers from 11 to 30. Students will also learn about telling time to the hour and half hour.

In religion, students have learned about the holy season of Advent and the following holy days: St. Nicholas' Day, the feast day of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Christmas, and Epiphany. During the third quarter students will learn about the season of Lent and will continue listening to Bible stories about Jesus.

For social studies students have listened to stories about the holiday of Thanksgiving and have learned about Martin Luther King, Jr. In science, students have been learning about winter.
